- A "Project Description and Impact" section has been added.
- "Navigating the Eagle Scout Service Project, Information for Project Beneficiaries" has been added at the back of the book. There is a checkbox for the beneficiary to indicate that a copy of the document was received.



#### Outdoor Webelos Leader

OWL Skills Training is for all Webelos leaders. This training course covers the skills & resources needed to teach the outdoor activity badges and helps to provide good & safe outdoor experiences. Completion of this training is required before a Webelos den can go on a campout.

#### Why OWL Training?

The type of outdoor program a boy receives as a Webelos Scout will determine, to a large degree, his interest in moving into a Boy Scout troop. It is our challenge to provide him with exciting and interesting outdoor activities that meet the purposes of Cub Scouting and the aims of the Boy Scouts of America.

This is your opportunity to learn the ways to accomplish those goals, to ensure your Webelos Scouts have a great outdoor experience!

#### OWL training is NOT just for Webelos leaders!

It is for all Cub Scout leaders who may at some point be leading a Webelos den or helping a Webelos leader. If you are a Bear leader, now is the perfect time to go! You will experience the training as a Webelos Scout.

The training does not cover advanced outdoor skills,
but rather it covers the basic skills you will need when
working with Webelos.

Since a big part of Scouting is **Outing**, you will learn the necessary information and skills to be comfortable in the outdoors, and the training will allow you to be successful in providing a Webelos outdoor program.

It is best if you have already completed Cub Scout Leader Basic Training. There is very little overlap between OWL and Cub Scout Leader Basic Training, and it is essential that all leaders understand the basic policies, methods, and procedures of Cub Scouting. There is still time to pick up Cub Scout Leader Basic Training. Please note that all registered leaders must now complete Youth Protection Training.

Note: This training is offered in the Spring and the Fall.

### Introduction to **Outdoor Leader Skills Training**

#### Hands-On Program

This hands-on program gives adult leaders the practical outdoor skills they need to lead Scouts in the out-of-doors. Imagine having hands-on knowledge of setting up a campsite, pitching a tent, hiking, outdoor cooking—all the skills necessary to see the outdoor program of the Boy Scouts of America come to life.

The skills sessions presented in Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills closely follow the Boy Scout Handbook and are meant to serve as an adult training outline. By using these skills sessions in conjunction with the Boy Scout Handbook, trainers can be sure new leaders are proficient in the basic outdoor skills through First Class rank, Each skills session references specific chapters in the handbook. Hands-on participation makes the best learning tool, so participants should leave the training experience knowing they can show their Scouts how to accomplish outdoor skills while fulfilling rank requirements. Back home, we want leaders to feel comfortable working with and instructing their Scouts. From pitching a tent to starting a cooking fire, they should feel confident in helping their youth leaders plan and carry out their own unit campouts and exciting troop programs using these skills. With that comes great satisfaction.

**Every Scout Needs** and Deserves Trained Leaders

Leaders should understand their responsibilities, the aims of the program, and how to deliver it with enthusiasm and fun. In short, a Scout's participation in the program should have a positiveinfluence on his life. #### BOY SCOUT CUSTOM LICENSE PLATES NOW AVAILABLE

For the first time, Scouters and Scout supporters can purchase an official lowa license plate honoring the Boy Scouts of America. Here's how:

- 1. Print the application from our website or pick one up at the Maytag Scout Center.
- 2. Return your completed application to the <u>Maytag Scout Center</u> with:

\$35 for a numbered plate, or \$60 for a personalized plate

- 3. Make checks payable to "Boy Scouts of America"
- 4. Do not send to the lowa DOT at this time!
- 5. When the minimum number of 500 paid applications (from the entire state) is received the applications will be filed and the plates produced. If 500 applications are not received 100% of your money will be refunded. After we receive the first 500 paid applications the process will become automated via lowa DOT. Plates may be ordered for automobiles, motor homes, multipurpose vehicles, trucks (3, 4 & 5 ton), travel trailers, and motorcycles. The annual renewal fees for these plates are \$10 for a numbered plate and \$15 for a personalized one and is due at the time you pay your annual vehicle


